For those customers still using Pervasive PSQL v9, please keep in mind that support ends on the 1st of January, 2010. End of customer support means that:

- Telephone support is available for a fee, but problem resolution is not guaranteed
- No enhancements or bug fixes will be added to the product

Pervasive says:

Each virtual instance must have its own PSQL license. This is stated in the PSQL EULA.

If PSQL is installed on a disaster recovery machine, the client must have a separate PSQL license. Pervasive licenses are per server only, and cannot be used on multiple machines.

Pervasive do not offer upgrade pricing through the Online Store. You may contact Pervasive directly for this pricing and information.
